




VERA CHAN

Represented by the Jennifer De Chiara Literary Agency, aspiring fiction author Vera Chan is a past Eleanor Taylor Bland award winner. She makes her fiction debut with her short story *Murderers' Feast* in the **MIDNIGHT HOUR** anthology. By day, she parlays decades of journalism experience at Microsoft as sr. manager, worldwide journalism relations.

Edited by Wall Street Journal bestselling author Abby L. Vandiver, MIDNIGHT HOUR is a stellar collection of crime fiction short stories showcases some of today's finest voices of color and one fiction debut of Vera Chan, under the pseudonym H-C Chan. Murderers' Feast tells the corporate noir tale of techpreneur John Manley, who left a trail of duped investors and damaged women in his wake. What happens when two hundred of his closest enemies gather for a five-day gourmet retreat?

Glenda is the author of the Trisha Carson mysteries. They are set in the San Francisco Bay area, including Marin, the East Bay State Parks and, of course, San Francisco. Glenda tutors first-generation, low-income high school and college students in English. She lives in San Rafael, CA with her dog, McCovey.

In **UNWITTING**, Erica Rosen MD Trilogy Book 1, a suicide bomber explodes at a major league baseball game. Dr. Erica Rosen becomes involved when she takes care for a young autistic man who holds information that may lead to the man behind the bombing and the rescue trained unwitting bombers.




KATHERINE HYDE
